Actress credits multiracial Malaysia for her adaptability

ACTRESS Yeo Yann Yann (*pic*) credits her success in breaking into Hollywood to being a Malaysian who is highly adaptable, *China Press* reported.

Yeo will be starring in the Netflix action thriller *Havoc* and the upcoming *American Born Chinese* series on Disney+.

After completing the filming of *American Born Chinese* and flying to Singapore, Yeo said she received many Hollywood offers, but these were all still being negotiated.

She joked that she is a slow worker and would let herself take two to three months' rest before making

any plans.

On whether she would return to Malaysia to film in the future, Yeo said as long as there is a good script, she will definitely come back.

Yeo also spoke about her role in Bollywood drama *Modern Love Mumbai* where she played a Chinese-Indian mother and challenged herself to speak in Hindi and Cantonese.

"About 80% of the drama was in Hindi, and the crew had arranged for two tutors to teach me.



"It took me half a year to learn the language and quite a while to learn the accent," she said.

Yeo added that she is fortunate to have been born in multiracial Malaysia, which she believes made her a more adaptable person.

"When I was filming in Mumbai, my crew members were surprised that I could say a few words in Tamil and eat curry. Don't forget, I grew up listening to Tamil and eating curry!" she said.
