WELCOMING REMARKS

- 1. - 6. The new ICOM definition aligns seamlessly with our national objectives. By integrating the Department of Museums into the Ministry of National Unity, we are reinforcing the idea that museums are pivotal in promoting national unity and understanding.
- 7. Our museums are not just about preserving the past; they are about engaging with the present and shaping the future. They provide spaces for reflection, foster mutual respect, and celebrate the diversity that makes Malaysia unique.

- 8. Today, **Malaysia is home to 232 museums**, encompassing federal level museums, state-run institutions, private collections, and personal museums. These establishments are not merely custodians of our past; they are vibrant centers that safeguard our heritage and promote national unity and inclusion.
- 9. However, as we celebrate this rich tapestry of museums, we must also acknowledge the challenges they face. Rapid societal changes, technological advancements, and the forces of globalization present new hurdles for these institutions. The key question now is: how can museums stay relevant in this ever-evolving landscape?

Digital transformation offers us the opportunity to preserve our rich heritage while making it accessible to a global audience.
- 12. By integrating digital technologies, we can enhance the visitor experience, engage with diverse communities, and ensure that our cultural narratives are preserved for future generations. For example, several strategic initiatives that should implemented by all museums:
 - Digitization of Collections
 - Virtual and Augmented Reality Experiences
 - Interactive Digital Exhibits
 - Mobile Applications and Online Platforms
 - Community Engagement and Inclusivity

- 13. Museums are more than repositories of artifacts; they are spaces where stories are told, identities are formed, and communities are united. In embracing digital transformation, we are not only preserving our past but also shaping our future. By making our cultural heritage accessible and engaging, we are fostering a sense of belonging and unity among all Malaysians.
- 14. In the meantime, the ministry is in the final stages of drafting a specific act to regulate activities in museums nationwide. This act is intended to provide a clear legal framework for museums and to ensure that they are managed effectively and sustainably.
- 15. The Ministry's goal is to create museums that are not only educational but also transformative spaces that inspire creativity, critical thinking, and a deeper appreciation for our shared humanity.
